


Al-Mominoon - The Believers

وَالَّذِينَ هُمْ لِلزَّكَاةِ فَاعِلُونَ

“And those who pay the Zakaat.”

The Characteristics of the Successful Believers:

The beginning Ayaat of Surah Al-Mominoon discuss the traits of successful believers. We started the year with Ibadur Rahman, who are the ones with a high level of Taqwa and priority. Our goal is to strive to become a part of them. However a successful believer should possess all of the traits in the ayaat of Al-Muminoon. For this week we will only focus on the ayaat about **Salah** and **Zakat**. Even though these are the pillars that are discussed from childhood, it is important to go into detail and discuss any misconceptions regarding them. We will start the ayaat on Tuesday 9/24/2019. We will be completing Ayaat 1-15 of Al-Mominoon all together Inshallah.

Quran and Islamic Studies Integration:

Inshallah the meaning and explanation of the ayaat of Al-Mominoon will include the Fiqh perspective as well. For this week we will only focus on the ayaat that are mentioned on the first page. We will discuss the importance of Salah and Zakat as well as the necessary information that is related to these two pillars of Islam and that is useful for the students in their daily lives. We will be discussing the following topics for each:
